

Needlestick injury and blood/body fluid contamination

1) Squeeze blood out of the contaminated body part and immediately rinse with water.

2) Contact the Student Affairs Division (ext. 2132-3), through which you can report the accident to the Infection Control and Prevention (ICP) outpatient clinic (ext. 3275-6), open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. During non-office hours, call the ICP physician on duty directly (PHS: 070-6963-0217) and ask for further instructions.

3) Register at Reception

4) Consult the ICP outpatient clinic (or emergency room, if so instructed by the ICP physician on duty).

For an HIV-related case, have a medical examination as soon as possible.

For an HBV-related case, have a medical examination within 24 hours.

*Regardless of the contamination status, it is ideal to have a medical examination as soon as possible after the injury.

5) At the ICP outpatient clinic, fill in a "Needlestick Injury/Cut Wound Report Form" or "Skin/Mucous Membrane Contamination Report Form."

6) At the Student Affairs Division, fill in an "Industrial Injury Report Form."
(If you have been injured during bedside teaching in the curriculum, the medication cost will be paid by the university)
